

Update on LCAP Goal 1 - Academic Success for All Students Presented to the Board

Dr. Lagozzino, Interim Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services shared an update on the District's LCAP Goal 1. Goal 1 includes Science, STEM, TOSAs, Visual and Performing Arts, UCI Math, AVID, one-to-one technology, and elementary PE. A key focus of Goal 1 is to provide mathematics support to all students including the use of Math Edge for students and UCI Math for staff. Additionally, the District's 2022 Summer Program will have a strong math focus embedded throughout the instructional day. The theme for the summer program is "Best Summer Ever" and will include General Education, Special Education, the Newcomer Program and Migrant Education. It will include staff professional development and planning time, enabling teachers to implement what they've learned in their summer classroom the next day.

Fiscal Services Presents Second Interim Report and Video

The Business and Fiscal Services Departments created a video explaining the details of the 2nd Interim Budget Report. The video provides information on the three-year span and multi-year projections, highlighting how the District's actions and decisions today affect its future fiscal standing. Like many districts throughout the state, MVSD continues to face declining enrollment due to such factors as families relocating and low birth rates. The continued enrollment decline and the rising STRS and PERS costs have severely impacted school district budgets statewide. Despite the significant hurdles, the Business and Fiscal Services Departments have worked tirelessly to ensure MVSD presents a balanced budget for the current year, as well as the next two years as required by state law.

Board Approves Resolutions Proclaiming March as Arts Education Month, Social Work Month, Women's History Month and National Nutrition Month

Joining the state department of education, the Board of Education proclaimed the month of March as Arts Education Month, approving a resolution recognizing Arts education, including dance, music, theater, visual, and media arts as an integral part of basic education for all students. The Board also approved a resolution for Women's History Month, urging all citizens to participate in this important time of exploring, learning, appreciating, and saluting the rich heritage and contributions women have made to our society. Additionally, a resolution for Social Work Month was approved, recognizing the tremendous contributions of all social workers and a resolution for National Nutrition Month was approved, recognizing food service professionals and Registered Dietitian Nutritionists for being an integral part of the Mountain View School District's educational process and for their commitment to promoting science-based nutrition in the hope of achieving optimum health for both today and tomorrow.
